



USE OF WATERCRAFT

As a boat user, for the well being and safety of all people using the water, whether they be swimming, boating or fishing, please ensure that you and your guests abide by the following rules:

Boat / Jet Ski Storage

All boats and jet skis must be stored in the boat yard or allocated berth when not in use. No riding on jet skis or boats is permitted when being towed around the Park.

Launching Area

No vehicles may be left at the jet ski or harbour launching areas at any time. Following launching, your car should be removed to your own parking area beside your accommodation. Trailers should be removed to the boat storage yard.

Harbour – East Shore

ALL harbour berths are personal, and may not be used by others under any circumstances.

Pontoons

The end of the pontoon is for loading and unloading purposes only. Under no circumstances may a boat be left unattended. Use of the jetty including the berths is at the boat owners' own risk.

Jet Skis

Jet Skis should be launched at the 'Jet Ski' launching area only, which is located on the East shoreline, near the mouth of the River Douglas. Jet skis are not permitted in the harbour at any time.

General Rules

1. All boats and jet skis MUST be REGISTERED with the Loch Lomond Park Authority in Balloch
Tel. No. 01389 722 600 and registration numbers must be displayed on the craft at all times.
All craft users must abide by the rules of the National Park authority and those of the Inverbeg Holiday Park.
2. All boats and Jet Skis MUST be INSURED and a copy of a valid insurance certificate MUST be provided to the park office PRIOR to arrival.
3. No ski-ing from the beach, pontoons, or through moorings is permitted.
4. If you have requested a berth on the pontoon, located off the North Shore, you will be allocated a numbered berth and no other berth or mooring should be used unless authorised.
5. You MUST display your park identification disk and also your trailer tag at all times. These will be given at check in.
6. Permits are required to fish all species of fish on Loch Lomond. Further information is available from the Loch Lomond Angling Improvement Association www.lochlomondangling.com
